Report on recent onomastic activities in Sweden (Katharina Leibring)

Most onomastic research in Sweden is to be found in Uppsala as both the university chair in Scandinavian onomastics and the Institute for Language and Folklore (SOFI) are situated there, but there has also been activities in Gothenburg, Lund and Umeå during the last 18 months.

The **chair in Scandinavian onomastics** at the university of Uppsala has recently got a new holder: Staffan Nyström from Stockholm, as Professor Svante Strandberg has retired. For ICOS members Professor Nyström will be familiar as the editor of volume 42 of Onoma on Urban toponymy. At present, about half a dozen **doctoral students** in Uppsala are doing active work on onomastic subjects. Their research is devoted to: parents' attitudes to today's given names (Emilia Aldrin), women's choice of surnames around 1900 (Sonja Entzenberg), soldiers' names (Roland Andersson), the development of Saami family names (Märit Frändén), the formation of Scandinavian bynames and hypochorisms (Stefan Jacobsson), settlement names in Bohuslän (Catarina Röjder) and microtoponyms in Uppland (Elin Forsberg).

Two **doctoral dissertation**s in onomastics, both at the Department of Scandinavian languages at the University of Uppsala were published in 2007: by Kristina Neumüller on hydronomic name-complexesⁱ and by Carina Johansson on urban names and name-users' perceptions of these. ⁱⁱ

Among **recent publications** the **four annual periodicals**: *Namn och Bygd, Studia Anthroponymica Scandinavia*, *Ortnamnssällskapets i Uppsala årsskrift* and *Sydsvenska ortnamnssällskapets årsskrift*, all have published new volumes containing articles and reviews that together cover a broad onomastic field. All of these periodicals have summaries in English and occasional articles are published in English or German.

Some **new books** (apart from the above-mentioned dissertations) are *Smeknamn och öknamn på personer nämnda i dagspressen* by Reinert Kvillerud,ⁱⁱⁱ *Nordiskt runnamnslexikon* by Lena Peterson,^{iv} *Bebyggelsenamnen i Mörbylånga kommun* by Per Vikstrand,^v and volume 3 of *Proceedings of the ICOS Conference in Uppsala 2002*.^{vi} Volume 4 is scheduled to appear this autumn.

The largest **conference** for Swedish and Scandinavian onomasticians in 2007 was the 14th Scandinavian Onomastic Congress in Borgarnes, Iceland in August, which gathered over 50 participants. The annual meeting of Scandinavian language planners, held in Uppsala in September, was devoted to names and name planning. A smaller symposium concerning the place-name element *torp* was held in Malmö/Lund, and two symposia in Uppsala and Umeå in late 2006 were devoted to names and multiculture. The proceedings from the Uppsala symposium were published last year under the title *Namn och mångkultur –flerspråkiga miljöer och kulturella influenser*. vii

Apart from the four long-running large place-name **projects** *Sveriges Ortnamn*, *Ortnamnen i Göteborgs och Bohus län*, *Skånes ortnamn* and *Ortnamnen i Övre Norrland*, and the *Lexikon över Sveriges Medeltida Personnamn* [Dictionary of Medieval Personal Names in Sweden] there are several newly started onomastic projects, all based in Uppsala.

- a) *From Nora-Anna to Foppa* is a project on nicknames in Swedish sports during the 20th century. One of its aims is to let the nicknames of sports idols reflect the development of Swedish sports as well as society in general (Leif Nilsson).
- b) A project on the historical naming of persons is *Denotations of individuals or* "name phrases" in Sweden ca 1300–1750, i.e. name phrases consisting of both names

and non-proprial designations, e.g. wife Anna, Anna Jonsdotter ('Jon's daughter'), Olaf's wife or Anna in the gate (Lennart Ryman).

c) *Settlement names and the new settlement archaeology* aims at understanding the genesis and continual life of settlement names in the Iron Age landscape of central Sweden (Per Vikstrand)

More and more of the material in the large place-name archives is being made available on the **Internet**. For example, much of the main Uppsala collection on Swedish place-names can be accessed via www.sofi.se. It consists of about 4 millions of name excerpts from oral or written sources that have been collected during the last 100 years.

Panel on Socio-onomastics as pragmatics at the 11th International Pragmatics Conference in Melbourne, Australia, July 12–17, 2009

The panel is organized by Terhi Ainiala & Jan-Ola Östman

The panel is the first event in a more general attempt to bring together research findings and researchers from pragmatics and socio-onomastics, and in particular at this conference to focus on names and naming in their social and cognitive context.

The panel focuses on scrutinizing research findings within socioonomastics in relation to the various fields within pragmatics that directly or indirectly deal with names and naming; cf. philosophical approaches (definite descriptions, deixis), cross-cultural pragmatics (names in contact, exonyms), cognitive issues (categorization in terms of naming), socio-pragmatics and politeness (terms of address), interaction (the use of and attitudes towards names, sociolinguistically in general, and in on-line interaction), and language and ideology (identity and naming).

Socio-onomastics as a field of research is a sub-discipline within onomastics (the study of names) that has only quite recently begun to be approached in a systematic manner. Traditional onomastics has largely focussed on the etymology and typology of names (particularly place names and personal names but also "other names" (commercial names, ship names, pet names, etc.)). Although socio-onomastics acknowledges the historical dimension of names and naming, it stresses the use of names in every-day interaction: how various names are used, why some names are avoided, why certain names are coupled with particular pejorative attitudes, and how name users perceive the names they use. As a whole, socio-onomastics takes into account the social, cultural, and situational domains in which names are used. Notably, social variation and situational variation are studied, and the reasons why people know certain names (but not others) are examined. The study of attitudes and stance towards names and name usage are also part of socio-onomastic research. (For more information on socio-onomastics, see the entry on "Socio-onomastics" by Terhi Ainiala in the 2008 Installment of the Handbook of Pragmatics (Benjamins, Amsterdam).

The panel is open for participation and presentations from scholars from all over the world and from different theoretical perspectives. We see the panel as a way to stake out the research situation in this field for the future, and we aim to bring socio-onomastics in line with general pragmatics research.

URBAN PLACE NAMES
International symposium, Helsinki 13–16 August 2009

The Research Institute for the Languages of Finland cordially invites the submission of paper proposals for its cross-disciplinary symposium on urban place names. The symposium will be held on 13–16 August 2009, in Helsinki, Finland.

OBJECTIVES

Recent years have witnessed a considerable rise in the interest in the linguistic aspects of urban processes. In particular, institutional procedures, commercial aspirations and everyday meanings related to toponymic landscapes have been studied in different historical and present-day urban settings. The goal of the path-breaking symposium is to gather scholars to discuss the current theoretical and empirical challenges of urban place name research.

Following issues, inter alia, will be addressed in the symposium: in what ways power structures and social identities are constructed and contested through the naming of streets and everyday places? What is the role of place names in the formation of lived everyday meanings and cognitive perceptions of urban space? What is the contribution of specific disciplines to the study of urban toponymies, and how might interdisciplinary approaches to it be best facilitated?

We invite scholars from different countries and disciplines (e.g., linguistics, onomastics, geography, history, cultural studies, anthropology, sociology, political science, and literary studies) to present theoretical openings and case studies on the above and related subjects.

The symposium will consist of keynote lectures, thematic sessions and excursions.

The symposium language is English.

SYMPOSIUM SITE

The symposium will be organized in Vuosaari, Helsinki. The venue of the symposium is Hotel Vuoranta (http://www.sodexo.fi/en-GB/hotel_vuoranta/). It is located in beautiful coastal surroundings, only a metro trip away from downtown Helsinki.

ACCOMMODATION

Hotel Vuoranta (http://www.sodexo.fi/en-GB/hotel_vuoranta/) is the most convenient place to stay during the symposium. More low-budget accommodation is available in Rastila Camping (for more information, see www.camping.fi > Rastila), located in the vicinity of the symposium venue.

SYMPOSIUM FEE

The symposium fee is 180 euros. It includes meals, a symposium banquet and two excursions in Helsinki and its neighbouring municipalities.

EXCURSIONS

The symposium includes two half-day excursions in the Metropolitan Helsinki. After the symposium, an optional excursion to St Petersburg in Russia will also be organized.
