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Onomastics in Parkatêjê language

Abstract: Onomastic studies in general — and the studies of the onomastic systems of indigenous languages in particular — require interdisciplinary investigations that address properly the diversity inherent in the field. This lecture aims to discuss how linguistic concepts dialogue with anthropology and ethnography in the study of the onomastic system of Parkatêjê, an indigenous language spoken by the Parkatêjê people, who currently inhabit the Mãe Maria Reservoir, in sotheast of Pará state, Amazonia, Brazil. I will discuss aspects observed in the description of the anthroponyms known and used mostly by native speakers of the Parkatêjê language. The methodology of the study consisted of bibliographic research and ethnographic research with data collection in the indigenous village.
